To address this problem, it is important to understand what people like you know and think about opioids and naloxone, a medication that can reverse an opioid overdose. What is the purpose of this survey?

The purpose of this survey is to better understand what community members know and think about opioids and naloxone.

What will I be asked to do?

You are invited to take a 5-minute survey.

How will my identity be protected?

Your answers are anonymous and cannot be linked to you.

What are the benefits?

Your answers will inform an evaluation of Michigan's naloxone standing order and identify opportunities for improvement.

What are the risks?

Taking the survey has minimal risk. You might feel uncomfortable answering some questions about opioids and naloxone.

Is my participation voluntary?

Yes, your participation is voluntary, and you may skip questions.

About Opioids and Naloxone

Opioids include pain relievers available legally by prescription, such as oxycodone (OxyContin®) and hydrocodone (Vicodin®), as well as fentanyl and the illegal drug heroin. All kinds of opioids can cause overdoses leading to death.

Naloxone is a medication designed to rapidly reverse opioid overdose. When administered in an opioid overdose situation, naloxone can save a person's life. Naloxone is available under the brand names Narcan® and Evzio®.
